New York, NY—Chamber Music America (CMA), the national network for ensemble music professionals, has announced the distribution of \$1,370,287 through its six grant programs to support the work of 74 ensembles and presenters across classical and jazz fields.

The 2023 grantees, reflecting a broad spectrum of sounds and stages, were selected by independent peer panels adjudicated in December 2022, March 2023, and June 2023. Individual awards, from \$10,500 to \$37,000, will be used to support projects in communities across 39 cities in 20 states.

"On behalf of CMA, I am honored to support such a diverse cohort of artists and ensembles who are committed to serving their communities through artistic innovation and equitable musical practices," says Kevin Kwan Loucks, CEO of Chamber Music America. "Through these longstanding grant programs that support the creation of new works and the engagement of unique mentorship

opportunities, CMA continues to foster the next generation of the industry—building on our organization's 47-year history of supporting promising artists and arts makers. I'd like to thank our generous funders in aiding this work, and I look forward to watching the development and future successes of the 2023 grantees."

The grant programs—*New Jazz Works, Performance Plus,* and *Presenters Consortium for Jazz* supported by the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation; *Classical Commissioning,* supported by The Mellon Foundation; *Artistic Projects,* supported by the Howard Gilman Foundation; and *Ensemble Forward,* supported by the New York Community Trust—and grantees are outlined below.
